Dear member,

The words, 'what can I get you?' have never been so eagerly anticipated. What will your first drink be I wonder? Looking at the forecast for Saturday it might be a cup of tea or coffee or perhaps a brandy but let's wait and see.

So, following the announcement that we will reopen the bar to club members and their guests this Saturday 4th July from 3pm, please find below information and safety protocol in line with government safety advice.

Please respect the rules which have been put in place to minimise the risk as much as possible for you and your guests and club staff. Most importantly, the rule around not congregating in groups of more than 6. Please also closely monitor your children and their friends to make sure they maintain social distance and do not form groups of more than 6.

Thame Town CC has conducted a Risk assessment and approved the following plans:

TTCC Bar Staff

Safety and welfare of staff and customers is paramount for us to re-open the club bar.

There will be two Perspex screens on top of the bar with a cut-out area for membership card and debit / credit card payments and a gap to pass drinks through to customers.

Face masks and gloves will be made available for staff to wear if they would like to.

Antibacterial spray/wipes will be made available on the bar to be used by staff.

The Bar will be divided into two stations for serving drinks and sundries. Each station will have use of a Perspex bar screen, one set of beer pumps, a fridge, Shorts prep equipment & credit card machine.

There will be shared use of one till only.

Membership card and debit / credit payments only, no cash. £45 contactless limit.

Please download and fill out your membership form and send to Sheena Beard there will be no paper application forms at the club.

Plastic glasses to be used for all drinks.

First Aid kit will be available behind the bar.

Clubroom area:

There will be a one-way system in operation

Right side double door (as you look from the ground) will be the one-way entry point.

Signage on floor spacing out 2 metre gaps.

Sign in sheet: The table inside the club room door will have hand sanitizer and a sign in sheet. Contact details of each member and their guests will be required on entering the bar in case we need to trace back. All contact details will be destroyed after 21 days.

The tables and chairs inside the clubroom are being used to block out the areas for the one-way system. There will be no drinking or gathering inside the clubroom

A standing point will be marked in front of the bar for customers to stand at whilst waiting excitedly but patiently for their drinks.

Tips of a financial nature (not advice) for bar staff can be made and are welcome.

Customers to Exit through middle double doors. There will be arrows to show this.

Chairs/tables will be used to show areas in use and to block off indoor gents' toilet door and kitchen.

Door to indoor ladies' toilets to be locked. Indoor ground floor accessible toilet will be made available upon request.

The main side door to the club will remain locked with signage directing people to the double doors looking onto the ground.

Patio area

There will be arrows marking 2 metre distancing from the right double doors and changing room toilets.

No sitting / loitering in the patio area unless queuing for bar or changing room toilets.

All front clubroom Doors will be left open for maximum ventilation.

Toilets

Customers will be able to use changing room toilets which can be accessed at the front of the ground. Home for ladies and Away for gents.

Changing room windows will be left open for maximum ventilation.

Floor markings will be put in place for social distancing.

Antibacterial spray and wipes available for wiping down areas used.

Signage asking customers to wipe down after use will be in use.

Signage reminding customers to wash their hands will be in use.

Bins available to put used wipes in will be made available.

Toilets will be cleaned & bins emptied after each session.

Garden: The area within 50 metres of the clubhouse exterior is our official licensed area, please remain within this area whilst consuming your drinks.

Benches will be set out, two each side of gate with min 2 metre distance between them.

Outside furniture to be set up before each session with 2 metre distance between and 6 chairs at each table.

DAF furniture to be used outside as required. Club room blue chairs must always stay indoors .

All furniture to be sanitized after each session and stored in changing rooms.

Bins will be put out at the front of the club in order to be accessible for customers to dispose of plastic cups/ bottles.

Staff will not clear cups and bottles. Signage to inform customers to clear their cups and bottles.

Signage to ask customers to maintain social distancing and not to congregate in groups of more than six.

Bar staff and club officials will be monitoring this at regular times.

Rain

In the event of rain we will close the bar because we are not currently set up to host indoor drinking. The decision on rain affecting play will be made buy the bar staff and their decision is final.

Opening/closing times will be subject to weather conditions.

Latest closing will be 9pm on Friday and Saturday nights and 6pm on Sundays to allow all extra cleaning.

These guidelines may be amended once cricket resumes or if Government guidelines change.
